Reconcile

- (a) To restore to friendship or harmony
- (b) To settle or resolve differences
- To make consistent or congruous
- To cause to submit to or accept something unpleasant
- To check (a financial account) against another for accuracy

Reconcile

- ²³ "Therefore if you are presenting your offering at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you,
- ²⁴ leave your offering there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and present your offering. (Matt. 5:23-24)

The other side

- "If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. (Matt. 18:15)
