






Freedom

- It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. (Gal. 5:1 NIV)

Freedom - defined

- A state of exemption from the power or control of another; liberty; exemption from slavery, servitude or confinement. *freedom* is personal, civil, political, and religious.

Liberty

- **2.** Natural *liberty* consists in the power of acting as one thinks fit, without any restraint or control, except from the laws of nature. It is a state of exemption from the control of others, and from positive laws and the institutions of social life. This *liberty* is abridged by the establishment of government. (Webster's Dictionary of 1828)



Liberty

- The *liberty* of one depends not so much on the removal of all restraint from him, as on the due restraint upon the *liberty* of others. (Webster's 1828)
- **1**: the quality or state of being free:
a (1) : freedom from usually external restraint or compulsion : the power to do as one pleases (2) : a condition of legal nonrestraint of natural powers (Merriam-Webster)
