TWO CROSSES

- Actually – two crucifixions
- *Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen (Gal. 1:3-5)*
 - "Rescue" – take out, deliver, remove

THE PROBLEM IN GALATIA

- Return to the law
- *"We who are Jews by birth and not sinful Gentiles, know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified. (Gal. 2:15-16)*
- Galatians 3:10-14

TWO CROSSES OR CRUCIFIXIONS

- *"For through the law I died to the law so that I might live for God. I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. (Gal 2:19-20)*

- *"Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Col. 1:27)*
