

DO WE GET HIM?

Nahum 1:6-9

Jonah

- “Go to Nineveh and call out against it”
- He heads to Tarshish
- The pagans on the ship
- The “appointed” fish
- “Yet forty days and Nineveh shall be overthrown”
- The pagans of the city – especially the king
- The shade, the plant and the worm
- “And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle.”

Nahum

- Perhaps about 100 years later
- About 60 years after Israel goes into captivity and about 40 years before Babylonian empire defeats Assyrian – Nineveh.
- An *oracle concerning Nineveh. The book of the vision of Nahum of Elkosh.*
- *² The LORD is a jealous and avenging God; the LORD is avenging and wrathful; the LORD takes vengeance on his adversaries and keeps wrath for his enemies.*
- *³ The LORD is slow to anger and great in power, and the LORD will by no means clear the guilty. (Nah. 1:1-3 ESV)*

Nahum

- *Woe to the bloody city, all full of lies and plunder– no end to the prey!*
- *2 The crack of the whip, and rumble of the wheel, galloping horse and bounding chariot!*
- *3 Horsemen charging, flashing sword and glittering spear, hosts of slain, heaps of corpses, dead bodies without end– they stumble over the bodies!*
- *4 And all for the countless whorings of the prostitute, graceful and of deadly charms, who betrays nations with her whorings, and peoples with her charms. (Nah. 3:1-4 ESV)*

Nahum

- *18 Your shepherds are asleep, O king of Assyria; your nobles slumber. Your people are scattered on the mountains with none to gather them.*
- *19 There is no easing your hurt; your wound is grievous. All who hear the news about you clap their hands over you. For upon whom has not come your unceasing evil?*
- *(Nah. 3:18-19 ESV)*
- What happened to their repentance?
