## TO SLAVES

 5 Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, 6 not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, <sup>7</sup> rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, 8 knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free. 9 Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him. (Eph. 6:5-9 ESV)

### TO SLAVES

- <sup>23</sup> Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men,
- <sup>24</sup> knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.
- <sup>25</sup> For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.
- **Colossians 4:1** Masters, treat your bondservants justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven. (Col. 3:23-4:1 ESV)

### PAUL'S PLEA

- "Onesimus my son"
- For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel. (1 Cor. 4:15 ESV)
- Onesimus useful, profitable, beneficial
- Vs. 11 & possibly 13

## RECONCILIATION

- Reconciliation as Jesus reconciled God and man.
- Paul took the side of the guilty to plead for forgiveness.
- Paul offered to pay what ever Onesimus owed.
- Paul brought about restoration and improvement.
