

Redeemed (2)

Mercy Seat - Leviticus 16

- Propitiation - the removal of wrath by offering a gift - to gain or regain the good will or favor of - appease - to offer a payment sufficient and pleasing to God to pay for, to ransom us, to free us from the guilt of all our sins.
- Mercy Seat is the place of propitiation

Day of Atonement - Leviticus 16

- Day of atonement - cover over, pacify, make propitiation
- Aaron to clean himself and put on priestly garments
- Take a bull as a sin offering for himself, his family, people
- Takes two goats - cast lots over them - one for the Lord and one to send away
- Takes coals and sweet incense to cover the “mercy seat” so he doesn’t die
- Sprinkles blood of bull on, to the east and in front of the mercy seat - sprinkles blood seven times

Day of Atonement - Leviticus 16

- He kills the goat of the Lord and brings the blood to the mercy seat and sprinkles the blood of the goat over and in front of the mercy seat as he did with the bull's blood
- Then he shall go to the altar with the blood of the bull and goat and put it on the horns of the altar, then sprinkle the blood on the altar with his finger seven times.
- He then will take the second goat, lay his hands on it and confess all the sins of Israel. Then give the goat to a man to take it into the wilderness and send it away.

Propitiation

- *But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.) (Rom. 3:5 ESV)*

Propitiation
